Happy New Year! By now you should have received a mailer from Walters detailing the program and when carts will be picked up. If you need to exchange your cart or need an additional cart please contact Walters Recycling & Refuse at 763-780-8464. **If you currently have walk-up service, you will need to call Walters at 763-780-8464 to resubmit your request to keep the service.**

Walters Recycling & Refuse 763-780-8464

Walters Recycling & Refuse provides residential recycling service to single and multi-family households. The City of Spring Lake Park contracts with Walters Recycling & Refuse for single-sort recycling service – no sorting or separating! Simply put all of your acceptable recycling items loose (do not bag) in the recycling cart and Walters will take care of the rest. **DO NOT put plastic bags in with your recycling.**

Find your schedule and answers about how to properly dispose of materials by using the Waste Wizard tool at **waltersrecycling.com/springlakepark**. Walters also has a Facebook page for residents to follow to get up-to-date information on service issues, inclement weather, holidays and delays in service. The Facebook information is located at: **Facebook.com/waltersrecycling**. You may also look on the City web page for your recycling day pick up and for all Special Events.

Single-Family Households

Place all of your recyclables in your single-sort container and wheel it to the curb by 6 am on your designated pick-up day. Remember, recycling is serviced Wednesdays, biweekly. Effective January 1, 2024, the recycling fee for single-family households is \$13.60/qtr., billed through the city on your utility bill.

Apartment Renters

Ask your manager about the centralized location for recycling at your apartment building. If your apartment building does not offer recycling, please contact your manager to see that it is added. By law, residents must be provided the opportunity to recycle. Effective January 1, 2024, the recycling fee for multi-family households is \$13.60/qtr/unit, billed through the city on the utility bill.

Organics Recycling

Organics are a resource, not a waste! Did you know that one third of what you throw away is organics that can be composted? You can drop off food scraps, non-recyclable paper products, coffee grounds and more at the Spring Lake Park Compost site. When you participate in the organics recycling program, your food scraps and non-recyclable paper products will be recycled into compost, a valuable resource that improves soil, reduces erosion and decreases the need for fertilizers.

Residents of Spring Lake Park composted 14.02 tons of organic material from January 1, 2022 - December 31, 2022. If you would like to participate it is easy and free. Please stop by City Hall to sign up and pick up a starter kit. Collect your organic waste in a compostable bag and tie it off. Drop your bags off at the City Hall compost area. If you run out of bags just stop at the front desk Monday-Friday during business hours to pick up more.
