- Appliances (\$12 - 30 each)
- Batteries: sealed lead acid, small household and rechargeable (\$0 - \$6.75/lb)
- Electronics
 - Printers, scanners and fax machines (\$10 - 35 each)
 - Hard drive destruction (\$5 each)
 - TVs and monitors: all sizes (\$20 - 85 each)
 - Small and medium items: mice, keyboards, DVD and VCR players, stereos, speakers, record players, coffee makers, toasters, toaster ovens, vacuums, phones, small appliances and video game consoles (\$0 - 6 each)
- Exercise equipment (\$25 - 40)
- Fluorescent bulbs (\$.50 - 2.50 each)
- Holiday lights (FREE)
- Mattresses and box springs (\$20 - 25 each)
- Paper shredding: 2 box maximum, no 3-ring binders or newspaper (FREE)
- Propane tanks (\$6 - 35)
- Scrap metal: clean and all non-metal material removed (FREE)
- Tires (\$7 - 9 each)

Prices have a range since they vary by the size and type of material.

No Batteries
or Electronics

Batteries and Electronics with Batteries

Why: Batteries and electronics with non-removable batteries can explode and start fires if crushed or punctured. Every month garbage trucks and recycling facilities experience fires when batteries are improperly thrown away.

Recycle: Batteries and electronics with non-removable batteries, can be taken to the Anoka County Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) facility or select recycling centers and drop-off events.

Tanglers are any item that get wrapped around sorting equipment at recycling facilities, such as plastic bags, holiday lights and electrical cords.

Why: These items become tangled on machinery and workers can spend hours each day removing them, causing costly processing delays.



No Plastic Bags
(drop-off only)

Plastic Bags, Stretch Film and Air Pillows

Reduce/Reuse: Avoid using plastic bags by bringing your own bag. Bring packaging materials to mailing stores for reuse.

Recycle: Clean, dry bags and stretchy film can be taken to large retailers or grocery stores. Also, puncture plastic air pillows and recycle it with other plastic film. Look for collection containers by store entrances.

Trash: Throw away non-stretchy cellophane, wet or food contaminated bags and remove plastic handles.



No Holiday Lights
& Cords

Holiday Lights and Cords

Recycle: Many city halls and recycling centers collect these items for recycling.

Food

Why: Food scraps can be 20 – 30% of what we throw away. Stop losing your hard-earned dollars on wasted food.
